Brecknock Consulting are pleased to announce the recent launch of two significant public artwork projects as part of streetscape upgrades in South Australia.

Semaphore Road

Brecknock Consulting was engaged as cultural advisors to oversee two major sculptural projects commissioned by City of Port Adelaide Enfield, as part of the Semaphore Road redevelopment. The commissions resulted from the initial streetscape master planning phase undertaken by Brecknock Consulting in 2005 as part of a team lead by GHD.

YAKKANNINNA (Sisters) created by South Australian artist Karen Genoff was inspired through consultation and participation by local Kurna Elders. The main upright element, reaching 6 metres and constructed out of Corten, is a stylised version of an Indigenous basket, which was originally created from the tufted grass tree *Xanthorrhoea semiplana*. Bronze cast feathers also feature on the structure. The work also incorporates three cast bronze woven mats, created by Auntie Cherie Watkins, and phrases in Kurna language.

Midden, created by South Australian artist Deb Sleeman, explores the rich history of the Semaphore area. The work represents a build-up of history, layer upon layer of cultural material. Deb also consulted with the local Kurna Elders during the concept development process.





Prospect Road - 'Village Heart'

Brecknock Consulting was part of the Jensen Planning and Design team engaged by City of Prospect to undertake the initial master planning for the major road corridor of Prospect Road. Brecknock Consulting provided cultural planning and integrated public art advice to the master planning process. The Master Plan was the recipient of a Commendation – Urban Planning Achievement, PIA SA, 2010.

Following the Master Planning process Brecknock Consulting was engaged to curate and project manage the Concept and Design Development phases of the public art commission. Sydney based artist Warren Langley was selected for the commission. The resulting artworks, which feature along the Prospect Road Village Heart precinct, include subtly changing LED lighting controlled by, and responsive to, the changing temperature throughout the day and night.
